**The Public Health (Condensed Milk) (Amendment)
Regulations, 1953**

Made - - - - 3rd November, 1953

Laid before Parliament 5th November, 1953

Coming into Operation 11th November, 1953

The Minister of Food and the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections eight and ninety-two of the Food and Drugs Act, 1938(a), and by the Transfer of Functions (Food and Drugs) Order, 1948(b), and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf, having consulted such representative organisations as appear to them substantially to represent the interests concerned with the purposes of these Regulations, hereby jointly make the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations shall come into operation on the 11th day of November, 1953, and may be cited as the Public Health (Condensed Milk) (Amendment) Regulations, 1953.

(2) These Regulations and the Public Health (Condensed Milk) Regulations, 1923 to 1948, shall be construed together and may be cited together as the Public Health (Condensed Milk) Regulations, 1923 to 1953.

2. The Public Health (Condensed Milk) Regulations, 1923(c) as amended(d), shall be further amended as follows:—

(a) by adding to the proviso to Regulation 4 thereof the following subparagraph:—

“(c) during the period until 31st December, 1955, the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Regulation shall not apply as respects full cream unsweetened condensed milk imported by the Minister of Food and intended for human consumption which contains not less than 7·8 per cent. of milk-fat and not less than 25·5 per cent. of all milk-solids including fat.”;

(b) by substituting for the proviso to Regulation 9 thereof the following proviso:—

“Provided that—

(a) the provisions of this Regulation shall not apply in any case where the condensed milk is intended to be re-exported or is contained in a tin or other receptacle whose gross weight exceeds five pounds;

(b) during the period until 31st December, 1954, the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Regulation shall not apply as respects full cream unsweetened condensed milk imported by the

Minister of Food and intended for human consumption which contains not less than 7·8 per cent. of milk-fat and not less than 25·5 per cent. of all milk-solids including fat.”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These amending Regulations permit for a limited period the sale of full cream unsweetened condensed milk, imported by the Minister of Food, containing not less than 7·8 per cent. milk-fat and not less than 25·5 per cent. of all milk-solids including fat.
